


1895

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



The Annual meeting  
of the International Board  
was held in the Alexandra  
Hotel 148 Bath St Glasgow  
on Monday 17 June 1895  
at 1. pm

Present Messrs R. F. Navison (Presiding) (Scotland)  
(Scotland) C. Grunp & B. P. Ferguson (England)  
J. Taylor & W. P. Dawson (Wales) & J. Reid  
Ireland. H. McDonald Sec. S. F. B. acted as Secy to the meeting

Minutes The minutes of meeting of 18 June 1894  
were held as read & adopted

Proposed The following proposals were submitted by the Football Ass. never  
dealt with as under vj

Laws - 5

Affected.	Proposed Alteration.
Law 5	That it be provided that the player, when throwing the ball, must be standing on the touch-line, and must not be allowed a run.

The foregoing was unanimously agreed to &  
the law was altered & read as follows vj  
"When the ball is in touch, a player of the opposite  
side to that which played it out shall throw it  
in from the point on the boundary line where it  
left the ground. The player, throwing the ball,

"must stand on the touch line, facing the field"  
 "I play & shall throw the ball <sup>9-9-90</sup>"

Law - 6 The aforementioned was withdrawn viz

... Law 6 That it be made clear that the kick-off mentioned in last line but one is from the opponents' goal.

The following were approved viz

... Law 6 Substitute "plays" for "kicks" in line 1.

... Law 6 Substitute "playing" for "kicking" in lines 3 and 9.

The alteration was negatived by 5 votes to 2

... Law 7 That the word "within" before "six yards of the goal-post," and before "one yard of the nearest flag-post," be substituted by the words "from a point not exceeding."

The amendment was defined as follows viz

... Law 10 That the Board be asked to define more clearly what is meant by the words "in the act of playing the ball."

"In the act of playing the ball means. actual contact with the ball."

It was agreed to make the above definition a foot note to Rule 10.

Suggestion  
was made  
to amend  
the rule  
as follows:  
The alteration  
was agreed  
to by the  
recommendation  
of Mr. Gregson  
and Mr. Craxton  
seconded by Mr. G. Jackson unanimously passed viz

it was decided that goal nets be used in  
all international matches

Vote of thanks On the motion of Mr Grunp seconded by  
Mr Taylor a vote of thanks to the Chairman  
terminated the proceedings at 4 pm
